PRIVATE WELL SITE **CROSS CONNECTION CONTROL QUESTIONNAIRE**

Backflow prevention and cross connection protection is the responsibility of the customer as well as the water purveyor. Your cooperation is vital to the success of this important program and to protect the potable water supply.

Pursuant to and in compliance with the provisions of California Code of Regulations, Title 17 related to drinking water the District has established cross connection rules and regulations. This is to protect the District system and the customer's home from the possibility of contamination or pollution, by isolating within customer systems such contaminants or pollutants which could backflow or back-siphon into the District's public water system. Under these rules a private well is considered an Auxiliary Water Supply.

Auxiliary Water Supply- *Any water supply, other than the District system, on or available to a customer system. These auxiliary waters may include water from another purveyor's public potable water supply or any natural source(s) such as well, spring, river, stream, lagoon, estuary, etc., or "used waters" or "industrial fluids." These waters may be polluted or contaminated, or they may be objectionable, and constitute an unacceptable water source over which the District does not have control.*

The type of protection that shall be provided to prevent backflow into the public water supply shall be commensurate with the degree of hazard that exists on the consumer's premises.
